### Selectmen's Report

### What's new in Hart's Location?

We have a new Municipal Agent! Next time you go to town hall for your motor vehicle registration, you can do it all in one stop. Complete MV registration services, both local and state are now available. Katie Landry completed her Municipal Agent training and Certification in February. This is a huge leap forward from our old system using a manual typewriter and dispatching you to Twin Mt, Bartlett or Tamworth to do the state portion of your registrations. We congratulate Katie on completing her training and for offering this service to the community. Katie is at Town Hall on Mondays from 4 to 5:30pm.

We have a new website! <a href="www.hartslocation.com">www.hartslocation.com</a> Same web address but a totally new layout. It's a work in progress, with more features to come. Our thanks to Barbara Sisson of Jackson for her contribution of time & expertise creating the new website design and hosting site. She did a great job and the new website was up and running prior to the peak volume of interest in the midnight vote.

We have a new town computer purchased locally at ComputerPort in Conway. Our old computer had an unsupported operating system that wasn't worth upgrading. The local purchase means local technical support and helps keep your tax dollars in the valley.

We a purchased a new printer specifically for Motor vehicle registrations. This was a requirement of the state for Municipal Agent Certification. Katie found a good deal from another municipality and the town was able to obtain the required printer at a discount.

The trees around town hall and across the railroad tracks had grown in height, blocking our satellite internet signal. This necessitated a new, higher mounting pole for our satellite internet dish and new support cables. We thank Rick Greenwood for doing the tree work as well as the mounting pole and support cable installation. The new installation is working well.

We have some new landscaping around the front of town hall, and in the satellite "planter". Katie and Dora DeMarco volunteered their time and effort to put in some new perennial beds. Rick Greenwood delivered the dirt. The town paid for the dirt and some of the plantings. This is an ongoing project, we can look forward to the blooms of summer and a better looking town hall in the years ahead.

Speaking of a better looking town hall, Chuck Landry and Bill King mounted the Town of Hart's Location sign on the side of the town building, which is a great use for the sign originally made for the top of the notch, but were unable to coordinate with DOT for installation.

Inside town hall, we now have a new accordion door to close off ballot room when not in use, and to help reduce heating costs. The new door looks great and allows easy access to the polling room, vital records safe and filing cabinets when needed. We'll still use the blueboard foam insulation to minimize heat loss during the winter months, which will be on the polling room side of the new door. Thanks to Phil St Hilaire for ordering the new door and to Phil and Chuck Landry for the installation.

In 2016, the selectmen are planning for the installation of a composting or incinerator toilet at town hall. This will go in the small closet space adjacent to the town clerk's desk. We will look for the most cost effective toilet for the limited use we have, without the installation of plumbing. The costs for this installation will come from the town hall capital reserve fund.

A few words about the budget. The board makes an ongoing effort to keep municipal costs down, and this is reflected in the lowest tax rate in the state for both municipal and local schools. We had unanticipated expenditures that put us over budget in 2015 by a total of \$1763, or approximately 5%. Some of these expenses were for the initiatives detailed above. Katie had training expenses and associated mileage costs. Our software license was out of date for the Arc GIS mapping system and we had to renew it before we could reinstall it on the new computer, etc. Full details in treasurer's report. The 2016 budget is based on our review of recent and anticipated municipal expenses. Although the 2016 budget is up \$3700 from last year's budget (11%), it contains only a modest increase of \$1900 before the addition of the new assessing line item. Despite this increase, it is likely that our tax rates will remain among the lowest in the state in the coming year.

The Annual Budget Hearing occurred in early February in tandem with the annual school budget hearing. Public notice of the hearings was posted in the local newspaper. Though not well attended, these hearings are the proper forum for debate and discussion of the annual budgets. The Board of Selectmen recommends support of the budget as written, with the amendment noted below:

Note to Amend the Budget: The 2016 budget includes a new line item of \$1800 for Assessing Services. These services were previously funded from the Revaluation Capital Reserve fund, and were not included in recent budgets. The balance due for services rendered in 2015 will deplete the fund. The new contract for assessing services for the next five years was received after the budget was prepared. The annual price is now \$1900. During deliberation and discussion of Article 2, the figure for Assessing Services should be amended from \$1800 to \$1900, for a revised total annual budget of \$34,950.

Congratulations to the whole community for a successful midnight vote on the Centennial of the NH Primary! Several people worked hard to make this quadrennial election to go seamlessly, and we were well represented in the press for continuing our role as the first incorporated town in NH to vote in the First in the Nation primary. We were featured in Yankee magazine, NBC's Today show, ABC news, Reuters, Bloomberg Media, the Washington Post and many other national and international media. The board recommends a vote on "Continuing the tradition of the midnight vote for the Presidential Primary and Presidential General Election in the years ahead". this can be done during discussion of Article 3, "Any other business that may legally come before the town."

On a personal note, I'm sorry to miss the annual meeting. I'll be on the Durand Glacier in the Selkirk Mountains of British Columbia. Thanks for your continuing support of our town.

### 2015 Annual School Meeting Minutes, Town of Hart's Location, NH

Tuesday, March 10, 2015 4:30 pm

Meeting called to order by moderator Les Schoof. Motion made to waive reading of the articles by Nancy Ritger. Seconded by Phil St. Hilaire

Articles 1, 2 & 3 to be decided by ballot vote tallied after 5pm.

**Article 4:** To see if the School District will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$38,276.00 in support of schools, for the payment of salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of the statutory obligations of the District, exclusive of all other articles.

Motion to accept Article 4 as written by Jon Goodreau, Seconded by Bill King. Article 4 passes.

Article 5: To see if the School District will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1500.00 to be placed in the Capital Reserve Fund (Special education) previously established for that purpose. This appropriation is in addition to Warrant Article # 4, the operating budget.

Motion to accept Article 5 as written by Jon Goodreau, Seconded by Bill King. Article 5 passes.

**Article 6:** To see if the School District will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5000.00 to be placed in the Expendable Trust Fund (Tuition trust Fund) previously established for that purpose. This appropriation is in addition to Warrant Article # 4, the operating budget.

Motion to accept Article 6 as written by Mark Dindorf, Seconded by Lindsay Lankin. Article 6 passes

Article 7: To transact any business that may legally come before this meeting.

Mark Dindorf made a motion to amend **Article 3** on the School District warrant, from "to elect a Moderator for the ensuing 3 years" to "to elect a School District Clerk for the ensuing 3 years" noting that the moderator, Leslie E. Schoof, had been elected to a 2 year term in 2014, and that his term does not expire until 2016. Mark also noted that the position of School District Clerk does expire in 2015 and that that position was on the School District Ballot. **Article 3 Changed from: "to elect a Moderator" to "to elect a School District Clerk".** Seconded by Nancy Ritger. Motion passes.

Mark Dindorf asked for clarification regarding the status of Fryeburg Academy as the high school of record. Fryeburg Academy remains the high school of record for the School District. A special exception is being made to send the current 8<sup>th</sup> grade student to Kennett High school instead. The exception is being made because with transportation, the overall cost to the school district is currently less expensive.

Mark Dindorf requested that the School Board go on record at its next regularly scheduled meeting that the high school of record is still Fryeburg Academy and that a special exception has been granted for the current high school student to attend Kennett High School, due to a lower overall cost to the school district.

Results of ballot vote for Articles 1, 2 & 3: Announced after polls closed at 5:00 pm

Article 1: To elect a member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.

Helen Brandon elected by Write In vote.

Article 2: To elect a Treasurer for the ensuing three years.

0 votes for an eligible resident.

Nancy Hayes, currently the appointed Treasurer, received all the write in votes, however, Nancy Hayes is not a resident of the School District. The School Board may at its discretion, appoint Nancy Hayes to serve another three year term as School District Treasurer at its next regularly scheduled meeting.

Amended Article 3: To elect a School District Clerk for the ensuing three years.

Mark Dindorf re-elected by ballot vote.

Motion to adjourn Annual School District Meeting was made at 4:40 pm by Mark Dindorf. Seconded by Jon Goodreau. Unanimous, pending announcement of results of Ballot votes for Articles 1, 2 & Amended Article 3.
